

PRINCETHORPE NEWSLETTER

This is the first newsletter from the new Parish Council. There are a number of developments to report on: (i) We have commissioned a traffic survey, data is being collected on volume and speed of traffic 2nd – 10th November; (ii) We are liaising with county and with other local councils and commercial interests re traffic management through our part of Warwickshire; (ii) We have produced a draft village emergency plan, but before publishing it, have secured input from the National Flood Forum to help resilience planning for flooding. Remember, Parish Council meetings are the second Thursday of every month and open to the public. The forthcoming meeting has a special item dedicated to preparations for flood risk planning.



Next Meeting of Princethorpe Parish Council – Thursday 12th November at 7:30 pm in St Cuthberts.

There will be a special agenda item on flood risk management in the village. The council will receive a presentation from Hannah Tankard (National Flood Forum) & Rebecca Ashworth (Flood Risk Management, WCC). The National Flood Forum, supported by WCC, is keen to establish a flood risk action group in the village. Many locations within Warwickshire have such groups. This agenda item will be open for public discussion.

All members of the village are welcome especially any who might be interested in the proposed flood risk action group.

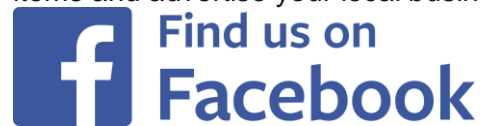
Princethorpe Village History Society.
